



# Weekly Family Worship

Nov. 16, 2014

**Theme:** Supremacy of Christ

**Our Point:** Jesus is our King, Creator, and Savior.

## **Read** — Listen to God: Colossians 1:9-29

People who are ruled by a king should demonstrate respect, honor, and obedience toward the one in authority. In this passage we see that believers have been made part of Christ's kingdom and should demonstrate these same attitudes to Jesus our King.

## **Worship** — Praise to God.

## **Do** — Walk with God.

**Option 1:** Have your family play a game of "Follow the Leader." Ask if the game would be any fun if everyone decided to go his or her own way and ignored the leader. If your children play sports, ask what would happen if no one listened to the coach. What if everyone in your child's class at school decided to disobey the teacher and do whatever they wanted? Everyone needs a leader. Our leader should be Jesus Christ. He is supreme and over all.

**Option 2:** Ask your family to help you list the various roles that Jesus plays throughout Scripture. (For instance, He is a servant, a teacher, and a friend.) After you have compiled a short list, point out each item and ask: *What do we learn about Christ from this description?* (For instance, since Jesus is a teacher, we learn to pay close attention to His words.) Draw this discussion to a close by asking the above question about Jesus' role as King.

## **Pray** — Talk to God.

Believers have been delivered from Satan's grasp and domain, and are now part of Christ's kingdom. Thank God for sending His Son to set us free from the grips of death. Thank Him for welcoming us into His kingdom, even though we are undeserving.

## **This week in Sunday School...**

### **Preschool**

Today your child learned Paul could rejoice in the Lord because living for Jesus was his focus. He didn't focus on the bad things around him, the things he didn't have, or the things he couldn't do. He focused on Jesus' love and telling others about Him. **I Can Rejoice in the Lord** by making Him my focus.

### **Elementary**

Your student learned Paul wrote a letter to the Christians in Colosse making sure they understood important truths about Jesus. He or she learned Jesus is the visible image of an invisible God; He is the Creator of the world; He existed before time; He is the head of the church; and He is supreme over sin and death. Your student was encouraged to focus on a different characteristic of Jesus each day for which to praise Him.

### **Youth**

Teens examined how Jesus is everything to the believer. They discussed the importance of sharing Him with the lost because He is humanity's only hope for salvation. Talk to your teen about ways they can share this news with others.
