

Weekly Family Worship Dec. 14, 2014

<u>Theme</u>: Idolatry <u>Our Point</u>: Idolatry hurts everyone.

<u>Read</u> — Listen to God: 1 Kings 12:25-33, 13:33—14:20

Jeroboam considered the time ripe for reform in Israel, and instituted major "religious reforms." He opened the priesthood to those formerly excluded, and expanded choices for places of worship. He also stubbornly tuned out the message from God, who called him to repentance.

Worship — Praise to God.

You are I Am — Mercy Me

<u>Do</u> — Walk with God.

Option 1: Have a scavenger hunt with your family. Make up a string of clues that lead from one place in your house to another. At the end of the scavenger hunt, have a worthless item as the prize, like a paper clip or a scrap piece of paper. Talk to your children about how they feel now that they have spent so much time and energy on something that has no value. Ask them to imagine spending their entire lives on something worthless— pouring hours and hours of time, energy, and patience into something that ended up being completely worthless. They would feel defeated, sad, and angry. This is what idolatry is like. Explain that only pursuing a relationship with Christ is worthwhile. (After making your point, you may want to share a special prize anyway, especially if your kids are young.)

Option 2: Ask your family to share experiences when children or friends did not pay attention to what they were saying. How could they tell the other one was not paying attention? What were the results? How do they avoid getting tuned out?

<u>Pray</u> — Talk to God.

Repentance was out of the question for Jeroboam because he simply would not listen to God's law, or to those whom he recognized as God's prophets. Repent of any unconfessed sin in your life. Pray that God would give you a heart humble enough to seek out true repentance.
