Know: Scripture likens God to a shepherd because He

provides for, leads, protects, and rescues His

people.

Think: Realize that we have deep needs. God alone

can meet these needs through our relationship

with Him as our Shepherd.

Trust our Shepherd to lead and provide for you. Follow His example of compassionate, nurturing,

selfless care for others.

Read—Ezekiel 34:1-31.

A competent shepherd works hard to take care of the needs of his flock, from finding lost sheep to providing protection and food. God is the Great Shepherd to us.

Do-Walk With God

Option 1: Explain to your child that like sheep wander from their shepherd, we tend to stray from God, whether we mean to or not. God takes the time to seek us out and save us, and once we get back to Him, He makes sure we have abundant protection, food, and rest. Play Hide and Seek with your children and explain to them that God seeks us out when we try to hide from him. Then play Follow the Leader with your children. Explain that God is our leader/Shepherd, and He will lead us down the best path.

Option 2: Find and display a picture or drawing of an ancient sheepfold or pen. (See bit.ly/sheepfold-images for examples.) Explain that shepherds would herd the sheep into the fenced or rock walled pen at night, and often sleep in front of the entrance to protect the sheep from predators. Comment on the need for "boundaries" in our lives. How are boundaries good for us? What kind of borders or boundaries do we need to protect us from dangers that would harm us spiritually or emotionally?

Pray—Talk to God

Cry out to God when facing difficulty, trusting Him to get us through. Pray that you and your family will learn to completely rely on God to get you through difficult times because He knows what is best for us and protects us.

Preschool

He or she learned God does the same for us, and we are to follow the guiding of our Shepherd.

Youth
