

Weekly Family Worship May 1, 2016

Know: Heartache, difficulties, and tragedy interrupted Job's life. He grieved, but stayed faithful to God.

Think: Be aware there is a spiritual battle taking place over you. You gain a victory every time you

remain faithful to God.

Keep trusting God when your circumstances overwhelm you. When you question "why" and don't understand, trust that God knows best.

Read—Job 1:1—2:3.

Satan accused Job of serving and obeying God only for what He could get out of it. Job responded to testing, and his faithfulness in serving God built a strong foundation that would allow him to endure great trials and great suffering.

Worship — Praise to God.

Do—Walk With God

Option 1: This week your child learned how to react when life falls apart. Job had everything he could ever want, and God allowed Satan to take it away in order to tempt Job. Explain to your child that sometimes bad things happen to us that we do not understand. Demonstrate this by giving your child building blocks or Lego blocks and then telling him or her to build something. Then lovingly tell your child you are going to knock down the creation. Explain that even though bad things happen to us, God does not leave us to fix it ourselves. Help your child rebuild an even better creation, and explain that God allows bad things to happen to us so we can become better people. (If you think knocking down your child's creation will upset him or her, just discuss what that would feel like. You know your child best. Don't lose the teaching moment just to make the point.)

Option 2: Take a few minutes to discuss the problem of false accusations. Ask the following:

- When have you, or someone you know, been the target of false accusations?
- Why are false accusations so dangerous and evil?

Prav—Talk to God

Practice faith and obedience before life falls apart. Pray that you and your family will learn to trust and obey God on the ordinary days, so that you will better be able to when life seems to be falling apart.

Teens learned that we can trust God to be faithful even when it seems life is falling apart. Talk to your teen about times you have experienced God's faithfulness in the midst of difficulties.
